

Report

Dear Fraternity, VANDEMATHARAM,

Welcome to all the delegates to the 44th Session of the Andhra Pradesh History Congress on 4th and 5th January, 2020 in the Historic City of Kurnool in the Historic K.V.R.College. On behalf of all the hosts, we spared no efforts to make your reception and stay as comfortable as possible. I urge your excuse if there were any initial lapses on our part. I wish all the Historians treat this occasion as OUR ANNUAL FESTIVAL.

Democracy is a Government by Three Dimensions: Discussion in the Society, Debate in the Legislature and the Decision of the Judiciary. It is with these objects to achieve the golden ideals of democracy that our elders have started the ANDHRA PRADESH HISTORY CONGRESS in 1976 at Jawahar Bharati College, Kavali, Nellore Dist. Grand Old Academician of Nellore Malireddy. Pattabhirama Reddygaru was the First President and the spirit behind the organization. We must greatfully remember those stalwarts associated with the movement. While Nelaturi Venkataramanaiah inaugurated it, Prof. Sarada Raju, Oruganti Ramachandaraiah and Raviprolu Subahmanayam, Bhattam Sriramamurthy, Freedom fighter and Hon. Minister and renowned litterateurs and academicians Dr.Rudraiah Choudary, Bangorey, Kalidasu Purushotham, P. Gopalakrishna, K.V. Ramana Reddy Kambhampati Sathyanarayana, Tarakam, D. Ramachandara Reddy, Giddaluru Venkateswara Rao and S.V.Bhujangaraya Sarma took active interest in the First Session as well as in building the Congress. Prof. Vakulabharam Ramakrishna, Retd. Professor, Hyderabad Central University and Lakshmidhar Reddy of Kavarli and few others who actively participated in the First Session, have been sources of strength of the Congress are happily with us today. With benevolent pride and pardonable privilege I feel elated to say that this is one of the few active History Congresses in the Country. Particular mention may be made of the compiling of the Papers presented in the Session into books and publishing them from almost its own resources.

It is disturbing to hear from the powers above, society and the and the stake holders of the academic activities, particularly the parents and the students that HISTORY is not a subject sought for in the job market. Some even go to the extent of questioning its usefulness in the curricular and social fabric. Let me remind the pessimists that one of the "Most complicated cases in the Judicial History of the World" (As told by the His Lordships of the Supreme Court of India) the Ayodhya @ Ramajanmabhoomi Case was judged, based heavily on the Archaeological studies. I hasten to add that Archaeology is an inseparable part of History; so also Anthropology and Geography. Therefore, for better understanding and get better acceptance by the society, the organisation may be renamed ANDHRA PRADESH HISTORY AND ARCHAEOLOGY CONGRESS.

"Can we understand Article 17 on the abolition of untouchability without understanding the social and political history of the practice"? Questions Dr. Sudhir Krishnamurthy, Vice chancellor National Law School of India, University Bengaluru in a signed Article in the Hindu, Sunday Magazine, Dt. 20th October, 2019. Answering affirmatively he says: "So in my view, Indian Constitutional and Political history must be a compulsory reading in all undergraduate programme, not just law programmes."

Full five years have elapsed after the bifurcation of Andhra Pradesh. Still it is suffering from teething trouble. If only the National and the State Policy Makers and the Administrators were to take lessons from the formation of Andhra State in 1953 and the Reorganisation of the States in 1956, the affairs would have been smoother. In 1953 a middle class town, Kurnool with just 50,000 population, lacking elementary infrastructure was selected Capital. There was no confusion. The whole political map of the country had undergone a sea change in 1956. The differences were settled with minimum troubles. There is much to learn from the Personalities; Nehru, Pant, Pattabhi, Prakasam, Rajaji, etc; their characteristic magnanimity. The Capital, Amaravathi is neck deep in controversy. I do not like to raise more controversy on this forum. However, I am of the firm opinion that the selection should have been made after a thorough discussion in the academic, political and social platforms. Instead of the experts from the Alien lands, plentifully available indigenous competent, Social Scientists, Archaeologists, Engineers and Technocrats should have been consulted by the Govt. Hundreds of various types of constructions; forts, temples, palaces, protection walls, etc. have, for Centuries withstood the onslaughts of the nature's fury and ravages by the invading enemy forces. Now that the Govt. has reopened the issue and has come forward with the proposal of decentralization of the Administration by building three Capitals, namely Legislative, Executive and Judicial, it is hoped that the better counsel will prevail on the Govt and involve the experienced administrators and Historians and Archaeologists in shaping the future policies and building the State structures.

"I am sick with the slogan: 'We must rewrite the History'. It has been viral. A new school of politicians and intellectuals express that every historian of the past was biased. Just like a Judge, the Historian analyses the history, based on the material and the evidence available. That is alleged as bias. This is a dangerous trend. I hasten to add that the analysis may be based on his own ideas and way of thinking. However Historian is not a mere story teller. He is a step above a press reporter. The Historian is a class by himself. He is a Social Scientist as much as an Economist or a Lawyer is! He is a seeker of truth. Different Judges write different Judgments on the same point of Law. Even Rulings of the Supreme Courts, delivered in various countries by the Judges with unimpeachable character and transparency, are reversed. Historian too is a human being. He may err". When I sent the above matter through a Whats App Message to Prof. Vakulaabharanam, he responded: "Well said, There is what is called Historians' bias. It depends on the sources. E.H.Carr said: 'Facts are sacred; interpretations are independent.' I appreciate your historical sense, though not a professional historian." Fattered to receive a compliment from a famous Historian.

Since we expect a good number of articles on Kurnool Papers in the Local History Session on Kurnool, I do not like to encroach on their arena. Let me thank one and all who, with their unfailing cooperation, directly and indirectly made the 44th Session possible in the Historic Kurnool City in the Historic Kasireddy Venkata Reddy Government College for Women. The Inaugural Session is scheduled at the Historic Darbar Hall of the Formers Raj Bhavan (KVRC (W), Kurnool wherein the Governor Sir Chandulal Madhavlal Trivedi administered oath of Office on 1 October, 1953 to Andhra Kesari Tanguturi Prakasam Pantulu as Chief Minister of Andhra State, the first Linguistic State in post Independent India. This was the first Womens' College in the whole of Rayalaseema.

We finally owe a debt of gratitude to contributors of articles and the publishers for their invaluable support to bring out this book.
